Say no to plastic bags

Earth Day is observed annually on April 22. The official Earth Day network site (www.earthsite.org) explores what we can do to make a difference, by saving energy and reducing pollution. It provides links to Earth Day events worldwide, including Australia. One of the site's recommendations is that we get rid of plastic bags. Some of the reasons include: The raw material of plastic bags is oil. Therefore, the more we use plastic bags, the more we waste oil - a nonrenewable energy source; the petroleum-based plastic bags take decades to break down and; they endanger wildlife, particularly sea life such as sea turtles and dolphins which can die of entanglement, suffocation and ingestion because they assume that these bags are jellyfish.
